

QWA ZONES AND LANYARD SYSTEM

The QWA zone and lanyard system is designed to support member protection, child safeguarding, and a high-quality event experience for all participants. By clearly defining access areas and assigning colour-coded lanyards to specific roles, we ensure that athletes have protected preparation spaces, children are kept safe from unauthorised contact, and officials and volunteers can carry out their responsibilities without interference.

Each zone has a purpose, and each lanyard grants access only where necessary for that role. This helps maintain a safe, respectful, and well-organised environment. All attendees are expected to wear their lanyard visibly and remain within their designated zones. Any questions or concerns should be directed to the Member Protection and Information Officer (MPIO).

ZONES

KEY SAFEGUARDING & ACCESS RULES

- Zone A (Athlete/Warm-Up): Access restricted to Athletes (Red), Coaches (Green), Medical (Turquoise), Independent Observers (Yellow), MPIO (Purple), and Event Director (Black).
- Zone B (FOP): Access restricted to Technical Officials (Navy), Medical (Turquoise), Independent Observers (Yellow), MPIO (Purple), and Event Director (Black).
- Media (gold) is an approved photographer/videographer or other media personnel.
- MPIO (Purple) is the first point of contact for any concerns around integrity, safeguarding, or behaviour.
- Event Director (Black) oversees logistics and general event coordination.
- Volunteers (White) support public-facing functions only and should not enter restricted zones.

LANYARDS

To maintain the integrity of the accreditation system and ensure sustainability across events, all lanyards will be issued at weigh-in or before the session starts; and be returned at the conclusion of each person's official duties.

Issuing Process

- Collection:
 - All lanyards to be issued at the designated Accreditation desk.
 - Must be issued by designated MPIO or Event Director.
- Bluecard
 - To receive a lanyard, the person must submit their bluecard to be stored for the duration of lanyard use.
 - Bluecards will be stored in a session-specific folder
 - The folder will be maintained by the designated MPIO or Event Director.

Return Process

- Return Point:
 - All lanyards must be returned to the designated Accreditation Desk.
- Condition Check:
 - MPIO or Event Director, at the return station, should check for damage and confirm return on the accreditation list.
- Reissue or Reuse:
 - Lanyards may be:
 - Held for reissue if a person is working multiple sessions or days.
 - Sanitised and stored if their duties are complete.
- Bluecard return:

- Bluecards will be returned on completion of official duties once lanyard is returned.
- Unreturned or Lost Lanyards:
 - Any lost or unreturned lanyards should be logged.
 - Repeat non-returns may result in restricted access at future events.
 - Any unofficial sharing or redistribution of lanyards is considered an integrity breach, and may lead to sanctioning by the QWA or AWF.

MEMBER PROTECTION & INFORMATION OFFICER (MPIO)

Lanyard Colour: Purple

Zone Access: All

Primary Responsibilities:

- Act as first point of contact for complaints, concerns, or breaches of conduct.
- Ensure compliance with safeguarding and child protection procedures.
- Be visible and approachable to athletes, coaches, and volunteers.
- Respond to or escalate issues involving inappropriate behaviour, welfare, or harassment.
- Maintain confidentiality and professionalism at all times.
- Liaise with Event Director and Independent Observer where necessary.

Required Knowledge/Training:

- Current MPIO accreditation (Play by the Rules or equivalent)
- Familiarity with QWA's Code of Conduct and Safeguarding Policy
- Incident reporting process

INDEPENDENT OBSERVER

Lanyard Colour: Yellow

Zone Access: A, B, C, D

Primary Responsibilities:

- Monitor the Field of Play and Mixed Zone for breaches of conduct or culture.
- Remain neutral, non-involved in event operations or competition outcomes.
- Record observations discreetly and objectively.
- Report concerns or trends to MPIO or Event Director post-session.

- Help create an environment aligned with QWA's values: safety, respect, and inclusivity.

Required Attributes:

- Understanding of QWA competition culture and stakeholder roles
- Observational objectivity and discretion
- No current conflict of interest at the event

MEDIA – APPROVED PHOTOGRAPHER / VIDEOGRAPHER

Lanyard Colour: Gold

Zone Access: C, D

Primary Responsibilities

- Capture footage or images of the competition for use by QWA, clubs, or approved media outlets.
- Respect the performance environment by operating unobtrusively and without interfering with athletes, coaches, or officials.
- Uphold privacy, consent, and dignity of all subjects, especially minors and vulnerable individuals.
- Share content as per QWA's media guidelines or agreements.
- Act professionally and represent QWA and the sport positively in all public interactions.

Conduct Requirements

- Seek permission before photographing individuals in non-competition contexts (e.g., warm-up, candid shots).
- Avoid blocking pathways, interfering with referees, or positioning in restricted zones.
- Do not enter the Field of Play (Zone B) unless explicitly escorted and authorised.
- Ensure no content depicts athletes or volunteers in distress, undress, or unflattering/unprofessional settings.
- Maintain awareness of child protection guidelines: no unauthorised photos of minors, especially without parent/guardian consent.

Media Accreditation Conditions

- Must be pre-approved by QWA or host club and wear a Gold lanyard with visible ID at all times.

- Any misconduct, breaches of privacy, or safety concerns may result in immediate removal of access.
- Media must adhere to all directions from the Event Director, MPIO, or venue staff.
- Final content may be subject to review if used for promotional or official event documentation purposes.

Equipment Guidelines

- Camera flash must not be used on or near the competition platform.
- Use of tripods, stabilisers, or long lenses should not obstruct walkways, FOP view-lines, or technical tables.
- Drone footage must be pre-approved, insured, and operated by a certified pilot — if permitted by venue.
